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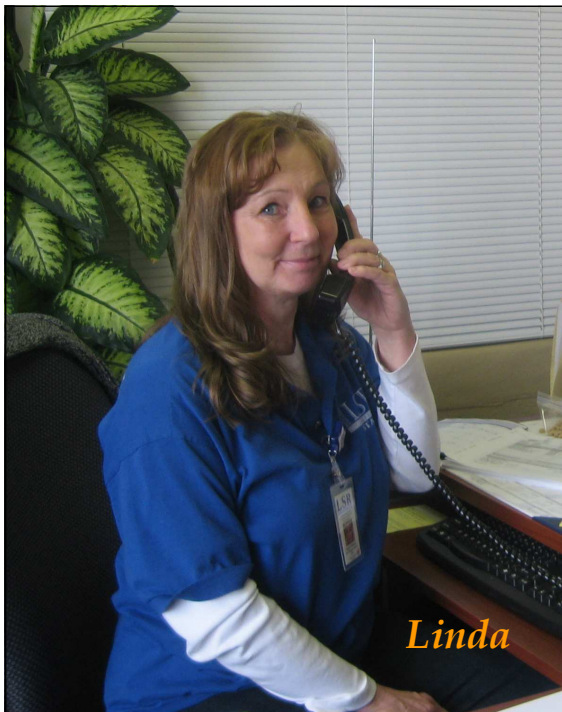

Linda does a variety of work for LSR and is a valuable asset to our business. She works with every department and fills in as a Direct Support

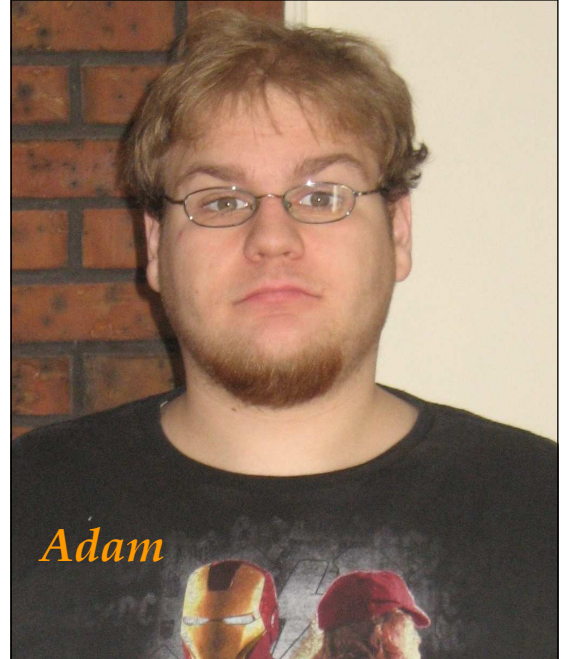
